- ▶ To take up programmes and projects in child health, disability and inclusion in consonance with Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 and United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UN-CRPD) keeping in view full life cycle needs and need for the access to enabling environment.
- ▶ To develop short-term and long-term education and training programmes to address the gaps in human resource development needs in the child health and disability rehabilitation.
- ▶ To take up research and extension (community health and rehabilitation) and publications focusing on various issues in child health and disability empowerment policies and practices.
- ▶ To develop innovative models in child health and disability empowerment involving communities through rights based, people centric approach.
- ▶ To develop capacities of cadres involved in child health, inclusion and disability empowerment and strengthen systems and community assets.

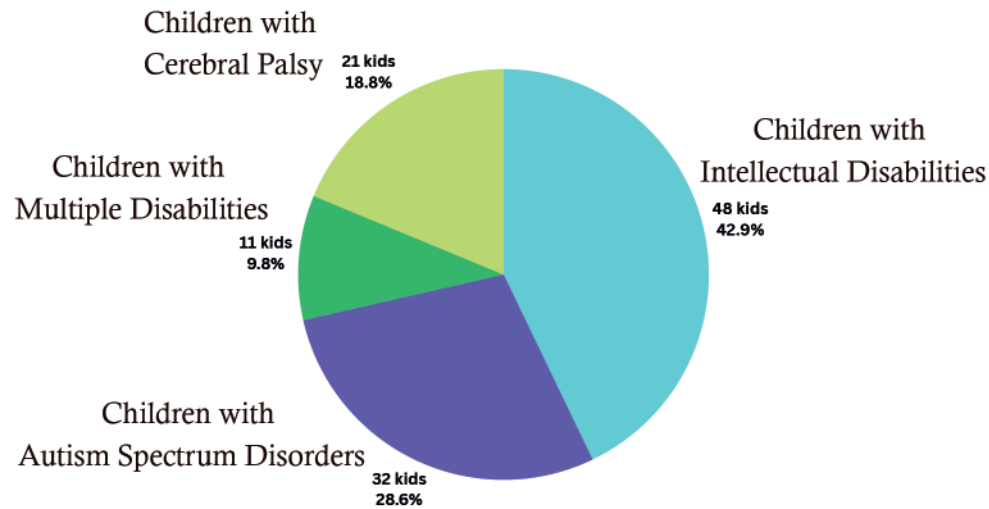
NEURO-DEVELOPMENTAL CLINIC

Neuro-Developmental Clinic (NDC) at Manasa was initiated in November 2017. NDC is providing wide range of services including screening high-risk infants and children with developmental delays and impairments; providing early intervention (EI) services for children with cognitive deficits such as intellectual disability (ID) and sensory-motor disorders and impairments like visual impairment, hearing impairment, speech impairment, weakness in limbs and syndromes and disorders like Autism, Down Syndrome, Pervasive Developmental Disorders, ADHD, Neuro-developmental disorders, Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis, Muscular Dystrophy and Learning disabilities and Memory Impairments; screening at birth particularly Audiological (Hearing) Screening/Assessment and Developmental Assessment; Speech & Language therapy; Physiotherapy; Occupational Therapy; Psychological Assessment and Behaviour Modification and Cognitive Therapy; and Special Education services. Parent education & counselling service is one of the main activities of NDC. Regularly on daily basis about 25 to 30 children with Neurodevelopmental disabilities are availing various health and rehab therapy services in the NDC.



MANASA SPECIAL SCHOOL

Manasa Institute has been running a Special School for the Children with intellectual disabilities since 1991. There are 112 children in the special school, who have access to all the special education services, therapeutics, periodical parents counseling for effective rehabilitation.



MANASA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER

Manasa Institute is also running a Vocational Training Center for youth with intellectual disabilities in several trades and is also extending support to get them into suitable employment or self-employment, to enable them live independently. This year 4 students of Manasa Vocational Training Centre have joined as helpers in their family business/ profession.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMMES:

- Teachers Day was observed on September 6, 2021, in which 30 members participated. All the Special Educators of Manasa Special School actively participated in the event.



- Orientation programme was conducted for Nursing Students from Sai Sanjeevini School of Nursing on November 29, 2021. Around 26 students participated in the programme. In this programme, awareness was provided on early identification and referral of children/ persons with disabilities, Acts & Policies for PwDs. They also observed the ongoing clinical sessions and special school classes during their visit



- ▶ An 'Inclusion Fest' was conducted by Manasa Institute on December 23, 2021, in which over 100 children from 3 nearby schools - Academic Heights Public School, Kakatiya Techno School, and Mandal Parishad Prathamika Patashala - participated. The participants were briefed on the theme 'Leadership and Participation of Persons with Disabilities towards an Inclusive, accessible, and sustainable post-Covid-19 world'. The programme included feedback sessions from parents, valuable inputs from dignitaries, and cultural activities by children of Manasa Special School.



- ▶ United Schools Organization (USO), Delhi conducted Drawing Competition on November 30, 2021, in which 15 children from Manasa belonging to category of Cerebral Palsy/Autism Spectrum Disorder/Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder/Intellectual Disability, participated and five of them won medals and certificates.



- ▶ 8 Children of Manasa Special School participated in dance program at Ravindra Bharathi conducted by the State Govt. of Telangana on December 3, 2021 on the occasion of International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD).



PARTICIPATORY PROGRAMMES

- ▶ Three staff members of Manasa namely Mrs. L. Lakshmi, Mrs. Roopa Devi, and Mr. P. Sudarshan, participated in Recipe Competition conducted by United Schools Organization (USO), Delhi via online mode, on July 21, 2021 and Mrs. Roopa Devi won 1st Prize & the other two got participation certificates.



CONCESSIONS & CAMPS

- ▶ A camp was conducted on July 13, 2021, for guidance in availing concessionary bus passes for the disabled children from TSRTC, which was utilized by 70 students of Manasa Special School who thereafter had taken the passes.

- ▶ An Eye Screening camp was conducted by LV Prasad Eye Institute on February 15, 2022, to the children of Manasa Special School. Eye check-up was done for 60 persons including children, parents and staff.



ONLINE CLASSES DURING PANDEMIC PERIOD

During Covid-19 period, as social distancing was mandatory, online classes were introduced to the children. 11 needy special children who were not having smart phones in their families, were distributed free smart phones in order to enable them also to avail online special educational services. Daily, 7 Special Educators of Manasa Special School conducted online classes to the students. Due to these online sessions, there was continuity in teaching Activities of Daily Living (ADL)/ Self-help skills to the children. Counseling sessions and parent interactions were also conducted online. Emphasis was made on maintenance of hygiene, and following stipulated Covid-19 precautions amongst the special children.



COVID- 19 RELIEF ACTIVITIES

Manasa Institute actively involved in Covid-19 relief activities. While creating awareness among its members, people from surrounding areas and giving alerts on preventive measures from time to time, it also extended assistance in its own way to needy people.

1. Relief material was distributed to around 170 needy people on 11th May, 2021.



2. Covid Vaccination Drive was conducted on 25th June, 2021 for a total number of 112 persons consisting of Manasa Staff Members and parents of Manasa School children, with the help of Programme Officers Mrs.Rama Devi, Mrs.Azima Begum, on behalf of the Telangana Government.



CASE STUDY

Master Ramu...

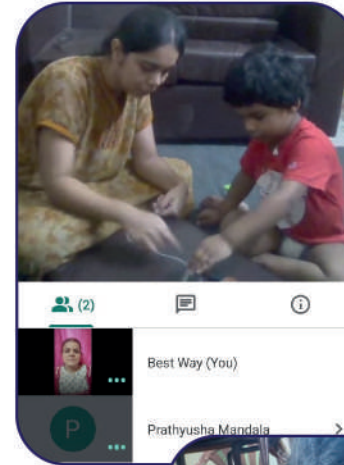
This child aged 6 years was brought to MICHADS in June 2021. The major complaint is that there is no age-appropriate speech and language, and has behavior problems. Detailed assessment of the child revealed that he has moderate level of cerebral palsy and intellectual disability with lack of communication, socialization, and self-help skills. The parents were counseled about his condition and explained that he needs to be admitted into Manasa Special School along with therapy sessions. After a few months, the child got successfully mainstreamed and had got admitted in Kendriya Vidyalaya.



SUCCESS STORY

Master Atharv:

Atharv's parents visited the Institute when he was 2 years 3 months old in February 2021. He was diagnosed with moderate ASD. He was unable to sit, with poor attention span, and poor communication. Speech therapy, occupational therapy, and special education services were provided by Manasa Institute. He developed eye-hand co-ordination, sitting tolerance, peer-group involvement, turn-taking, pre-reading, pre-writing skills, and socialization. After availing special education and therapy services at Manasa for 9 months, the child's parents shifted to USA in November 2021.
