- » Manasa values and recognizes protection of rights of children, women and vulnerable people.

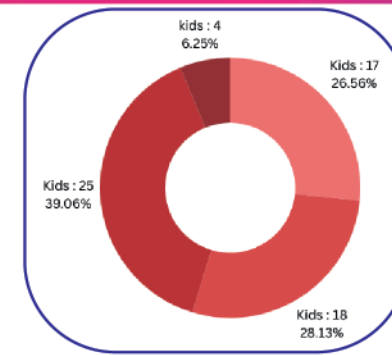
OBJECTIVES

- » To take up programmes and projects in child health, disability and inclusion in consonance with Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 and United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD) keeping in view full life cycle needs and need for the access to enabling environment.
- » To develop short-term and long-term education and training programmes to address the gaps in human resource development needs in the child health and disability rehabilitation.
- » To take up research and extension (community health and rehabilitation) and publications focusing on various issues in child health and disability empowerment policies and practices.
- » To develop innovative models in child health and disability empowerment involving communities through rights based, people centric approach.
- » To develop capacities of cadres involved in child health, inclusion and disability empowerment and strengthen systems and community assets.

MANASA SPECIAL SCHOOL

Manasa Institute has been running a Special School for Children with Intellectual Disabilities since 1991. The details pertaining to 2022-23 are as follows:

Total admissions	: 64 children
Children with Autism	: 17 – 26.56%
Children with CP	: 18 – 28.13%
Children with ID	: 25 – 39.06%
Children with Multiple Disabilities	: 4 – 6.25%

MANASA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER

Manasa Institute is also running a Vocational Training Center for youth with intellectual disabilities in several trades and also extending support to get them into suitable employment or self-employment, to enable them to live independently. In the year 2022-23, three students of Manasa Vocational Training Centre have joined as helpers in their family business/ profession.

MANASA NEURODEVELOPMENTAL CLINIC

This clinic facilitates clinical services involving range of services. The clinic screens high-risk infants and children with developmental delays and impairments and provide early intervention (EI) services for children with cognitive deficits such as mental retardation and sensory-motor disorders and impairments like visual impairment, hearing Impairment, speech Impairment, weakness in limbs and syndromes and disorders like Autism, down syndrome, pervasive developmental disorders and ADHD.

The clinic also provides screening and therapeutic services for Neuro-developmental disorders, Cerebral Palsies, Multiple Sclerosis, Muscular dystrophies and learning disabilities and memory impairments. Screening at birth particularly Audiological (Hearing) Screening/ Assessment and Developmental Assessment, Speech & Language therapy, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Psychological Assessment and Behaviour Modification and Cognitive Therapy & Special Education services are provided. Parent Education & Counselling Service is one of the main activities of NDC.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMMES

World Autism Awareness programmes was conducted on April 4, 2022, in which 100 persons participated. The Theme for this year was 'Inclusive Quality Education for All'.



SUMMER CAMPS

Three summer camps were organized for children with disability and their parents. They were segregated into categories – Autism, Slow Learners & ID, and CP.

- Autism Support Summer Camp was conducted for Special Children and Parents from May 5 to 7, 2022 (three days), in which 60 persons participated.



- Slow learners (ID) support camp was conducted for special children and parents from May 18 to 20, 2022 (three days), in which 74 persons participated.



- Cerebral Palsy (CP) Support Camp was conducted for special children and parents from May 10 to 12, 2022 (three days), in which 54 persons participated.



During these Summer Camps, there was emphasis on domestic activities, parent interaction, and generalization.

- International Day of Persons with Disabilities was organized on December 3, 2022 in which 127 people participated. The program included encouraging talks by the dignitaries followed by cultural activities by the children.



- Teachers' Day programme was celebrated on September 5, 2022. 92 persons participated in the program.



PARTICIPATORY PROGRAMMES

- Around 20 children participated in a Charity Run - NMDC Hyderabad Marathon, at Necklace Road, Hyderabad on May 2, 2022.



- 19 children participated in district level sports competitions organized by Govt. of Telangana on November 24 & 25, 2022.



» 12 Children participated in dance programme conducted by Govt. of Telangana in LB Stadium, on November 28, 2022.



» 52 children participated in drawing competition conducted by UNESCO and USO on February 22, 2023.



» Orientation programme for New Life Members of Manasa was organized on February 19, 2022. 30 Life members participated.



» Dental Camp was conducted for special children and parents on June 15, 2022, in which 91 availed the benefits.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR

A tour programme was organized for staff members of MICHADS to Laknavaram, Ramappa Temple and Warangal city on October 30 and 31, 2022. 19 staff members participated. They visited Thousand Pillar temple, Bhadrakali temple, Laknavaram, Ramappa Temple.

CASE STUDY MASTER MUKUND VIHAR

This child aged 2 yrs old was brought to MICHADS in Jan 2023. The major complaint was that there was no age appropriate motor skills, speech and language, and some behavior problems. Detailed assessment of the child revealed that he has developmental delay. The parents were counseled about his condition and explained that he needs to be admitted into Manasa Special School along with therapy sessions. After 7 months, the team successfully mainstreamed the child. The child got admitted in Artistic Clique – The Pre-School. He is able to walk with aid. Physiotherapy and Speech therapy services are being provided to him.



SUCCESS STORY

BABY RISHIGNA

Parents of rishigna visited the Institute when she was 4 yrs old. She was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy. She was unable to sit, and had poor communication skills. Physiotherapy, speech therapy, and special education services were provided by Manasa Institute. She developed eye-hand co-ordination, peer-group involvement, pre-reading, pre-writing skills, and socialization. After undergoing Manasa services for 2 yrs, the child is able to walk with support. She has also joined in Government School at Jayapuri Colony, Bandlaguda
